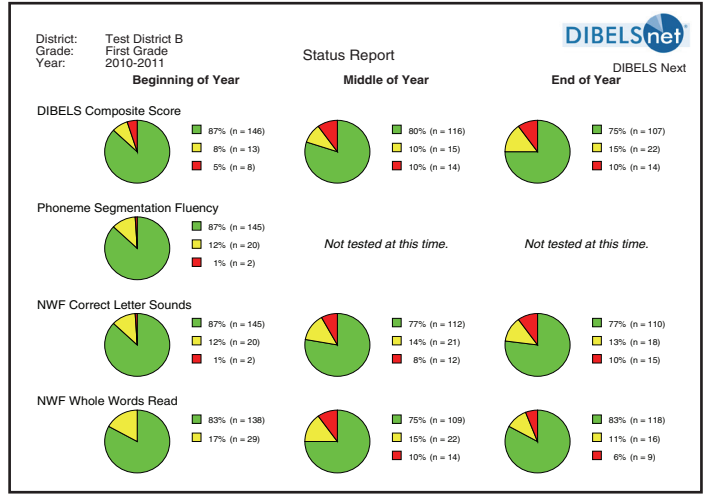
**DIBELS Next Survey Online Training.**

by DIBELSnet users is the creation of the Parent Report, which allows schools to create an individual report for each student that explains his or her DIBELS scores in a way that can be easily understood by parents.

DIBELSnet supports DIBELS Next, IDEL (DIBELS in Spanish) and DIBELS 6th Edition. Over 400,000 student records were managed by DIBELSnet during the 2012–2013 school year.

In the fall of 2011, Dynamic Measurement Group launched a new data reporting service that maximized input from DIBELS users to create a premier, low-cost data management and reporting service for DIBELS data.

The development of DIBELSnet was driven directly by the authors of DIBELS, Drs. Ruth Kaminski and Roland Good. The site is regularly updated with new features and reports that are useful for school systems. A recent example of a development driven

Since DIBELSnet is from the authors of DIBELS, it always uses the standardized administration procedures and interpretive information.

In the design of DIBELSnet, care has been taken to create an interface that is easy to use and decreases the amount of time needed to enter data. All DIBELS Next scores that require calculation, such as DORF Accuracy and the Composite Score, are automatically calculated following data entry.
